





The authorities that exist have been established by God. ² Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves.

³ For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and you will be commended.

⁴ For the one in authority is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for rulers do not bear the sword for no reason. They are God's servants, agents of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer.

What Does The Bible Say?

⁵ Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also as a matter of conscience.

The Greek word hupo-tasso, which has been translated as "submit" or "be subject," literally means to arrange stuff respectfully in an "orderly manner underneath".

A second meaning of the same Greek word (not used by Paul) means "to obey".

New Testament Greek, "to submit" does not always mean to obey!

Paul himself did not obey civil authority. Nor did he suggest that the state and its officials must always and absolutely be obeyed. He recognized that the power of law can be used for justice or for injustice and evil. So he urged his readers to be subject insofar as conscience allows.

'How can you advocate breaking some laws and obeying others?'

The answer lies in the fact that there are two types of laws: just and unjust.

One has not only a legal but a moral responsibility to obey just laws.

Conversely, one has a moral responsibility to disobey unjust laws.

St. Augustine said that 'an unjust law is no law at all.'

Romans 13 is not a manifesto on the divinely ordained power of the state, and it does not call for absolute obedience to civil authorities. Instead it offers a provisional account of the limits of civil authority for all people of conscience.

⁶ This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. ⁷ Give to everyone what you owe them: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor.

⁸ Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law.

⁹ The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not murder," "You shall not steal," "You shall not covet,"[a] and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

10 Love does no harm to a neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law.

Romans 13 presupposes an ideal system of government. This was not always, if ever, the case with the Roman Empire. "The most obvious counterproof would be the execution of Yahshua under Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor of Judea,".

Acts 4: 18 So they called them and commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Yahshua. 19 But Peter and John answered and said to them, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you more than to God, you judge. 20 For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard."

Revelation 6:8

"O Sovereign Lord, holy and true, how long before you will judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth?"

About those who attempted to use Romans 13 to compel submission to German atrocities, Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, "No state is entitled to read St. Paul's words as a justification for its own existence."

In his "Letter from a Birmingham Jail," Martin Luther King Jr. argued that we can not and should not obey unjust laws.

What should Christians do when governments who are supposed to do good instead do evil?

- 1. Obey them
- 2. Non-violently resist only when necessary
