

# **“Where Will The Antichrist Come From?”**




**Two weeks ago, I did a teaching where you thought I was going to talk about the “Where Will The Antichrist Come From?” video.**

**That title was camouflage for a lesson on the use of AI in ministry.**




**Tonight, we are actually going to analyze what was said in the video which used the likeness of Elon Musk.**




**As we review the contents of that

# The Narrative



**The Antichrist won't arrive looking like a villain. He'll arrive looking like the answer to a world exhausted by conflict, division, and uncertainty.**


**What if the Antichrist isn't  
some Roman emperor  
reborn or a random political  
strongman from Europe?  
What if his origins are closer  
to Israel than most people  
think? What if, in fact, he  
comes from within?**

**The Bible does not explicitly state in any single verse the exact geographic origin, nationality, ethnicity, or specific country from which the Antichrist (also called the "man of lawlessness," "beast," or "little horn") will come. The term "Antichrist" itself appears only in 1 John and 2 John (e.g., 1 John 2:18, 1 John 2:22, 1 John 4:3, 2 John 1:7), where it describes deceivers who deny Yeshua, but these passages do not specify an origin.**

**The closest symbolic indications are the "beast rising out of the sea" (Revelation 13:1) and the "little horn" from the fourth beast (Daniel 7:8), pointing to a Gentile or Roman-associated origin in prophetic symbolism.**

**Daniel 9:26–27 — Refers to a future "prince who is to come," whose people (in AD 70) destroyed Jerusalem and the temple (historically the Romans).**

**2 Thessalonians 2:3–4 — Calls him the "man of lawlessness" or "son of destruction," who exalts himself in the temple proclaiming to be God. No origin is given here.**



**When you get to Revelation 7, one of the 12 tribes is missing, Dan. The tribe of Dan is completely left out. And in its place, another tribe is listed twice (Manasseh as part of Joseph).**

Revelation 7:4-8 (NKJV)

**<sup>4</sup> And I heard the number of those who were sealed. One hundred and forty-four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel were sealed:**

**<sup>5</sup> of the tribe of Judah twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Reuben twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Gad twelve thousand were sealed;**

**<sup>6</sup> of the tribe of Asher twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Naphtali twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Manasseh twelve thousand were sealed;**

**<sup>7</sup> of the tribe of Simeon twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Levi twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Issachar twelve thousand were sealed;**

**<sup>8</sup> of the tribe of Zebulun twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Joseph twelve thousand were sealed;**

**of the tribe of Benjamin twelve thousand were sealed.**

**Jacob (in giving his blessings) called Dan a serpent. An adder in the path that bites the horse's heels so that his rider falls backward. Gen 49:17**



**Genesis 49:17 (NKJV)**

**Dan shall be a serpent by  
the way, A viper by the path,  
That bites the horse's heels  
So that its rider shall fall  
backward.**




**The tribe of Dan had a track record of idol worship. They were the first tribe to set up a counterfeit religious system in Israel. In the book of Judges, we see them creating their own priesthood, their own graven images, leading people away from true worship.**



**Judges 18:30-31 (NKJV)**

**30 Then the children of Dan set up for themselves the carved image; and Jonathan the son of Gershom, the son of Manasseh, and his sons were priests to the tribe of Dan until the day of the captivity of the land.**

**31 So they set up for themselves Micah's carved image which he made, all the time that the house of God was in Shiloh.**




**Later, when the kingdom split, the northern king Jeroboam set up two golden calves to keep people from going to Jerusalem to worship. And one of those calves was in Dan. The tribe became synonymous with spiritual compromise, with leading people astray.**



1 Kings 12:29-30 (NKJV)

**29** And he set up one in Bethel, and the other he put in Dan. **30** Now this thing became a sin, for the people went to worship before the one as far as Dan.



**When Revelation lists the tribes and Dan is missing, some scholars believe it's a prophetic warning, a signal, a clue. Could the Antichrist come from the line of Dan? It's a theory that's been discussed for centuries.**



**If you're looking for a figure who appears Jewish, who could gain the trust of Israel, but who carries a legacy of deception and counterfeit religion, the tribe of Dan is worth paying attention to.**



**With Nimrod's Tower, God looked down and saw a unified rebellion, and he confused their languages, scattering people across the earth. Babel fell apart. But the spirit behind it, that didn't die. It just moved.**

**Genesis 11:5-8 (NKJV)**

**5 But the Lord came down to see the city and the tower which the sons of men had built. 6 And the Lord said, "Indeed the people are one and they all have one language, and this is what they begin to do; now nothing that they propose to do will be withheld from them. 7 Come, let Us go down and there confuse their language, that they may not understand one another's speech." 8 So the Lord scattered them abroad from there over the face of all the earth, and they ceased building the city**



**Babel represents more than a historical event. It represents a philosophy. The idea that humanity can unite and achieve greatness without God. That we can build our own utopia, our own tower, our own salvation. And that idea has reappeared again and again throughout history.**



**That spirit didn't vanish. It migrated north. It took root in new empires. And one of the most significant of those empires was Assyria. Because Babel didn't end. It evolved into one of Israel's greatest enemies, Assyria.**



**Again and again, the Assyrians invaded, besieged, and scattered the northern kingdom of Israel. They took the 10 tribes captive, and most of those tribes were never fully restored. Assyria wasn't just a political enemy. It was a spiritual one. It embodied the same rebellious, godless empire building that started at Babel.**

## 2 Esdras 13:40


<sup>40</sup> these are the ten tribes which were led away from their own land into captivity in the days of King Hoshe'a, whom Shalmane'ser the king of the Assyrians led captive; he took them across the river, and they were taken into another land.



**The Bible doesn't just talk about Assyria in the past tense. Prophets like Micah and Isaiah describe a future Assyrian who will invade Israel in the last days, not the empire person. Micah 5:5 calls him the Assyrian when he comes into the land. (Micah 5:5 NKJV) And this One shall be peace. When the Assyrian comes into our land, And when he treads in our palaces, Then we will raise against him Seven shepherds and eight princely men..**




**Isaiah 10 speaks of an Assyrian king who will be used as a rod of God's anger, but who will ultimately be destroyed. Many prophecy scholars see this future Assyrian as the Antichrist. (Isaiah 10:5-7, 10-11) <sup>5</sup> “Woe to Assyria, the rod of My anger And the staff in whose hand is My indignation. <sup>6</sup> I will send him against an ungodly nation, And against the people of My wrath I will give him charge, To seize the spoil, to take the prey, And to tread them down like the mire of the streets.”**



**7 Yet he does not mean so, Nor does his heart think so; But it is in his heart to destroy, And cut off not a few nations.**

**10 As my hand has found the kingdoms of the idols, Whose carved images excelled those of Jerusalem and Samaria, 11 As I have done to Samaria and her idols, Shall I not do also to Jerusalem and her idols?' ”**




**The Roman legions that carried out the destruction of Jerusalem in 70AD didn't come from Rome. They came from the east. They were Roman legions recruited from regions that used to be part of the Assyrian Empire, modern day Syria, Turkey, Iraq. The soldiers who demolished the temple, who scattered the Jewish people, came from Assyrian territory.**



The Roman legions involved in the siege of Jerusalem and the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 AD were composed largely of "eastern peoples" (provincials from the eastern Roman Empire, such as those from Syria, Asia Minor/Anatolia, Egypt, and nearby regions) rather than predominantly "true Romans" from Italy. By the reign of Nero (around 68 AD) and into the Flavian period (Vespasian and Titus), provincial recruitment dominated. Historians note that legionaries of provincial birth outnumbered Italians by about 4–5 to 1 empire-wide, with the shift even more pronounced in the eastern legions stationed in places like Syria, Cappadocia, and Egypt.

**And Daniel 9 speaks of the people of the prince who is to come destroying the city and the sanctuary. If those people were Assyrian, then the prince, the Antichrist, might also have Assyrian roots. (Daniel 9:26-27) <sup>26</sup>**

**“And after the sixty-two weeks Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself; And the people of the prince who is to come Shall destroy the city and the sanctuary.**

**The end of it shall be with a flood,  
And till the end of the war  
desolations are determined. <sup>27</sup> Then  
he shall confirm a covenant with  
many for one week; But in the  
middle of the week He shall bring  
an end to sacrifice and offering.  
And on the wing of abominations  
shall be one who makes desolate,  
Even until the consummation,  
which is determined, is poured out  
on the desolate.”**



**Islam has its own end times prophecy and is remarkably detailed. According to Islamic teaching, a figure called Dami will rise in the last days. He will unite the world under a single religion. He will bring peace and justice. He will rule from Jerusalem.**



**The Dami is likely al-Masih ad-Dajjal (often simply called the Dajjal), the "Deceitful Messiah" or false messiah in Islamic eschatology. This is the major antagonistic end-times figure in Islam, analogous to the Antichrist in Christian tradition. (Note: "Dami" appears to be a misspelling or variant of "Dajjal," as no prominent Islamic figure matches "Dami" exactly, but the description aligns closely with Dajjal.) The Dajjal is not mentioned in the Quran at all. (Grok 3)**



**The Mahdi in Islamic prophecy does many of the same things the Bible attributes to the Antichrist. He appears during a time of chaos. He brokers peace. He is charismatic, powerful, and widely celebrated. And he comes from the Middle East, specifically from regions that overlap with ancient Assyria.**



**The Mahdi ('the Guided') is a messianic figure in Islamic belief. He is comparable to the Christian and Islamic idea of the return of Yeshua and the Mashiach ben David in Judaism. He is believed to appear at the End of Times to rid the world of evil and injustice.  
(Alma'Itah, Qais Salem; Haq, Zia ulf)**



**Islamic prophecy also includes a figure called Issa, their version of Yeshua. And in their story, Issa returns not to oppose the Mahi, but to support him. He breaks crosses, abolishes certain religious practices, and calls people to follow the Mahi.**



**To save believers from these horrors, the Mahdi will appear and Isa bin Maryam (Yeshua) will descend from heaven to assist him. The sun will rise from the west. A breeze will blow causing all believers to inhale it and die peacefully. (Sahih Muslim, Book 001: 0273)**



**If you're a Christian, you're waiting for Yeshua. If you're a Muslim, you're waiting for the Mahi and Issa. But what if the figure who appears is not the true Messiah, but a counterfeit? What if the Mahi and the Antichrist are the same person, and the Issa who supports him is the false prophet described in Revelation?**



**Geographically and theologically, the pieces align in ways that are hard to ignore. If a leader rises from the Muslim world with that kind of religious and cultural momentum behind him, he wouldn't just have regional influence, he'd have global influence. And if he also managed to gain the trust of Israel, say through Jewish ancestry from the tribe of Dan, you'd have a figure positioned unlike anyone in history.**



**Yeshua himself gave us a clue that most people read right past. He said that the last days would be as it was in the days of Noah. Now when you hear that, you probably think of the flood, right? Judgment, destruction, people ignoring the warnings. And that's part of it. But there's something else happening in Noah's time that's easy to miss.**

**Luke 17:25-26 (NKJV)**

**<sup>25</sup> But first He must suffer many things and be rejected by this generation. <sup>26</sup> And as it was in the days of Noah, so it will be also in the days of the Son of Man:**



**Genesis 6:4-7 describes something strange, something that had never happened before and hasn't happened since. It talks about the sons of God coming to the daughters of men and their offspring were called the Nephilim, giants, hybrids, beings that were not fully human.**


## Genesis 6:1-7 (NKJV)

<sup>4</sup> There were giants on the earth in those days, and also afterward, when the sons of God came in to the daughters of men and they bore *children* to them. Those *were* the mighty men who *were* of old, men of renown. <sup>5</sup> Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man *was* great in the earth, and *that* every intent of the thoughts of his heart *was* only evil continually. <sup>6</sup> And the LORD was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart. <sup>7</sup> So the LORD said, "I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth, both man and beast, creeping thing and birds of the air, for I am sorry that I have made them."

The Nephilim (often translated as "giants," "fallen ones," or "mighty men") are first mentioned in the Bible in the Old Testament, specifically in Genesis 6:4. (GROK 3)



**So, when Yeshua says the last days will be like the days of Noah, maybe he's not just talking about moral decay. Maybe he's talking about the corruption of humanity itself. And look around today. What are we doing? We're editing genes. We're merging human intelligence with artificial intelligence. We're creating synthetic biology.**




**We're talking seriously about enhancing the human body with technology, about uploading consciousness, about creating beings that are smarter, stronger, longer lived than anything nature or God designed.**

**We're standing at the edge of a transhuman revolution. And whether we realize it or not, we're opening the same door that was opened in the Days of Noah.**






