

The Purpose of Flags

- * Ancient flags were considered to connect to spiritual power and represented gods and deities.
- * Provided visual reference for soldiers engaged in combat
 - * Identification of a nation or a people
 - * Communication
 - * Mark territory

- * Oldest continuously used flag is from Denmark from 1200 AD
- * The etymology of the word flag appears in an old English word "flakken" which means to flutter.
 - * Flag like symbols have been used in China from the 11th century BC.
 - * The development of Chinese silk "modernized" the shape of flags.





* Oldest flag is the Shadad Standard from Persia



Early representations of "standards" can be found on Egyptian bas-reliefs such as the Narmer Palette, which is said to be the earliest representation. They are know as vexilloids or flag-like standards and were symbols of the names of pre-dynastic Egypt. The ancient Greek writers attributed the creation of standards to the Egyptians. These "standards" usually consisted of figures of sacred animals on the end of a staff or spear.



* While China, Greece and Persia are all known to have used cloth banners to designate parts of their armies, in ancient times, it was the Romans who made the most widespread use of flag like symbols to represent their armies.

* These banners known as vexillum are dated to 300 AD


* Another Roman standard that was wide spread by the time of the 4th century was Draco or Dragon. It would take the form of a dragon affixed to a lance with silver jaws and a body of colorful silk.


