Yahovah created time for us.

This is not Jewish time keeping, it is the method, established and mandated by Yahovah, to determine and count days, months, and years.

The first teaching ever done, over 10 years ago by Messianic Delaware, was called "The Creator's Calendar". That's how important this topic is.

So, How Do We Determine Time In The Bible?

Before we can discuss how Yahovah calculates time, we need a quick review of how man calculates time.

Calendar Types Pagan Julian Gregorian Creator's

Pagan:

Sun God worship – Moon God worship – or combination of both.

They worship a variety of God's. Multiple time systems based on where you were in the world and the customs and tradition of the people.

Mayan, Chinese, Hindu, Japanese, Egyptian, Germanic

The Julian Calendar

Introduced by Julius Caesar in 46 BC.

It was the predominant calendar in the Roman world, most of Europe, and in European settlements in the Americas and elsewhere.

The Julian calendar has a regular year of 365 days divided into 12 months. A leap day is added to February every four years.

The Julian year is, therefore, on average, 365.25 days long.

This is the calendar we all grew up with and the most widely used one in the world.

It was intended to approximate the tropical (solar) year. The calendar did not compensate for this difference between the two. As a result, the calendar year gained about three days every four centuries compared to observed equinox times and the seasons. This created what is known as the Precession of the Equinoxes.

Gregorian:

This discrepancy of the Precession of the Equinoxes was corrected by the Gregorian reform of 1582. The Gregorian calendar has the same months and month lengths as the Julian calendar, but inserts leap days according to a different rule.

Consequently, the Julian calendar is currently 13 days behind the Gregorian calendar. The Julian calendar has been replaced as the civil calendar by the Gregorian calendar in all countries which formerly used it, although it continued to be the civil calendar of some countries into the 20th century.

It is named for Pope Gregory XIII, who introduced it in 1582. Because the celebration of Easter was tied to the spring equinox, the Roman Catholic Church considered this steady drift in the date of Easter undesirable. The reform was adopted initially by the Catholic countries of Europe.

Genesis 1

¹ In the beginning Elohim created the heavens and the earth;

⁵ And Elohim called the light, Day. And He called the darkness, Night. And there was evening, and there was morning, day one.

Time is so important to the Creator that he begins identifying it in the very first verse of the Bible.

And, if it is that important to Him, it should be that important to us.

His instructions don't end there:

Genesis 1:14

And Elohim said, Let light sources be in the expanse of the heavens, to divide between the day and the night. And let them be for signs and for (Holy day) seasons, and for days and years.

Exodus 12: 2: This month shall be the head of months for you. It shall be the first of the months of the year for you.

So that takes us to how Yahovah reckons time.

Bonus 1 What is an Adar Bet?

Adar Bet

A 13th or Leap month. If the barley is not Aviv after the 12th month, a 13th month of Adar Bet is added. In that way, the barley, by default, will be Aviv at the first sliver of the new moon.

Bonus 2: What is a Shmita and when does it occur?

Sabbath Year or Shmita Year

A Sabbath Year or Shmita Year. Every 7th year during Shmita, the land is left to lie fallow and all agricultural activity, including plowing, planting, pruning and harvesting, is forbidden by halakha (Jewish law). A variety of laws also apply to the sale, consumption and disposal of shmita produce. All debts, except those of foreigners, were to be remitted.

Bonus 3: What is a Jubilee Year?

Jubilee Year

Every 50th year. 7 weeks of 7 years - Slaves and prisoners would be freed, debts would be forgiven, land will return to its original owner.

The barley is ripe enough to roast and make bread for the Firstfruits Offering. It is the agricultural starting signal for the beginning of a new year.

What is the Aviv Barley, Passover, Unleavened Bread, and First Fruits sequence?

First sliver of the renewed moon & barley Aviv

— day one of the 1st Month

Day 10 of the month — Passover lambs selected

Day 14 of the month — Passover lambs are sacrificed.

Passover occurs

Day 15 of the month – Feast of Unleavened Bread begins
The Sunday following the regular Sabbath that week
– Feast of the Firstfruits (Yom Bikkurim)
Counting of the Omer begins
50 days later Shavuot occurs

For how long are these Feasts applicable? Forever

How long can a month be?

29 or 30 days

How many months make up a year? 12 or 13

How does the Creator control the universe through his calendar?

Context for the timeline of Yahovah's feasts.

For signs, and seasons, making covenants, and appointed times.

Israel (preferably Jerusalem)
