Several years ago I presented a teaching which showed how Old Testament thought and statements are replicated in the New Testament and vice-versa.

We'll see later in this teaching the effect of this fact.

# I do not speak or read Hebrew. Translations are based on multiple references found on the Internet

Can we agree that each letter in the Hebrew alphabet has multiple meanings?

The English Alphabet

The letter "A" has no additional meaning.

It only signifies a hard sound Aaa or a soft sound ahh

The Hebrew Alphabet

Aleph (X)

Is a picture of an ox head representing strength and power from the work performed by the animal.

This pictograph also represents a chief or other leader. When two oxen are yoked together for pulling a wagon or plow, one is the older and more experienced one who leads the other. Within the clan, tribe or family the chief or father is seen as the elder who is yoked to the others as the leader and teacher.

Aleph can also mean oxen, yoke, learn, or the number one.

Aleph also indicates the Oneness and Unity of the Creator.

#### **Shalom**

שַׁלוֹם

Shalom is also spelled as sholom, sholem, sholoim, shulem).

It is a Hebrew word meaning peace, harmony, wholeness, completeness, prosperity, welfare and tranquility and can be used idiomatically to mean both hello and goodbye.

As it does in Hebrew, it can refer to either peace between two entities (especially between man and God or between two countries), or to the well-being, welfare or safety of an individual or a group of individuals.

So based on context and rules of grammar, Hebrew words can have multiple meanings, often beyond what the author meant to say.

Likewise, did you know that Hebrew names have inherent meanings imbedded in them?

# These names have no inherent meaning in English.

# This is not the case in Hebrew.

Take for example the first name in the Bible.

Adam **□TX** 

This is the Hebrew word for "man". It could be ultimately derived from Hebrew אדם (adam) meaning "to be red", referring to the ruddy color of human skin, or from Akkadian adamu meaning "to make".

# Let's look at some early Hebrew Biblical names and their meanings.

Where in the Bible do we find the names (genealogy) of the early biblical characters?

Genesis 5

# Genesis 5 New International Version (NIV) From Adam to Noah

<sup>1</sup>This is the written account of Adam's family line. When God created mankind, he made them in the likeness of God. <sup>2</sup> He created them male and female and blessed them. And he named them "Mankind" when they were created.

<sup>3</sup> When Adam had lived 130 years, he had a son in his own likeness, in his own image; and he named him Seth. <sup>4</sup> After Seth was born, Adam lived 800 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>5</sup> Altogether, Adam lived a total of 930 years, and then he died.

<sup>6</sup> When Seth had lived 105 years, he became the father of Enosh. <sup>7</sup> After he became the father of Enosh, Seth lived 807 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>8</sup> Altogether, Seth lived a total of 912 years, and then he died. <sup>9</sup> When Enosh had lived 90 years, he became the father of Kenan.

<sup>10</sup> After he became the father of Kenan, Enosh lived 815 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>11</sup> Altogether, Enosh lived a total of 905 years, and then he died. <sup>12</sup> When Kenan had lived 70 years, he became the father of Mahalalel. <sup>13</sup> After he became the father of Mahalalel, Kenan lived 840 years and had other sons and daughters.

<sup>14</sup> Altogether, Kenan lived a total of 910 years, and then he died. <sup>15</sup> When Mahalalel had lived 65 years, he became the father of Jared. <sup>16</sup> After he became the father of Jared, Mahalalel lived 830 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>17</sup> Altogether, Mahalalel lived a total of 895 years, and then he died.

<sup>18</sup> When Jared had lived 162 years, he became the father of Enoch. <sup>19</sup> After he became the father of Enoch, Jared lived 800 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>20</sup> Altogether, Jared lived a total of 962 years, and then he died. <sup>21</sup> When Enoch had lived 65 years, he became the father of Methuselah.

<sup>22</sup> After he became the father of Methuselah, Enoch walked faithfully with God 300 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>23</sup> Altogether, Enoch lived a total of 365 years. <sup>24</sup> Enoch walked faithfully with God; then he was no more, because God took him away. <sup>25</sup> When Methuselah had lived 187 years, he became the father of Lamech.

<sup>26</sup> After he became the father of Lamech, Methuselah lived 782 years and had other sons and daughters. <sup>27</sup> Altogether, Methuselah lived a total of 969 years, and then he died. <sup>28</sup> When Lamech had lived 182 years, he had a son. <sup>29</sup> He named him Noah and said, "He will comfort us in the labor and painful toil of our hands caused by the ground the LORD has cursed."

<sup>30</sup> After Noah was born, Lamech lived 595 years and had other sons and daughters.

<sup>31</sup> Altogether, Lamech lived a total of 777 years, and then he died. <sup>32</sup> After Noah was 500 years old, he became the father of Shem, Ham and Japheth.

In Hebrew, one can infer the meaning of a name by looking at the root of the name.

Let's look at the names of the 9 descendants of Adam and see if we can draw any conclusions

#### **ADAM DTX**

This is the Hebrew word for "man". It could be ultimately derived from Hebrew אַדְמָ ('adam) meaning "to be red", referring to the ruddy color of human skin, or from Akkadian adamu meaning "to make". According to Genesis, Adam was created from the earth by God (there is a word play on Hebrew אַדְמָה ('adamah) "earth"). He lived 800 years.

ADAM = Man

SETH-שֶׁת

Means "placed" or "appointed" in Hebrew. He lived 912 years

SETH = Appointed

ENOSH- אֵנוֹשׁ

Means "man, person, or mortal" in Hebrew. He lived 905 years

**ENOSH = Mortal** 

KENAN- - קינו Means "possession" or "sorrow" in Hebrew. He lived 910 years

**KENAN** = Sorrow

### MAHALALEL- מהללאל Means "the blessed or praised of God" in Hebrew. He lived 895 years

## MAHALALEL = The Blessed God

JARED- דְרֵי, דְרֵי From the Hebrew name בְּרֵי (Yared) or בְּרֵי (Yered) meaning "descent" or "shall come down". He lived 962 years.

## JARED = Shall Come Down

ENOCH- - Jiin

From the Hebrew name מתוֹת (Chanokh) is said to mean "dedicated" or "teaching". He was the author of the apocryphal Books of Enoch. He lived 365 years

An interesting prophecy surrounds Enoch. As long as Enoch's son lived, God's judgment of the flood would be withheld. Jude 14:15.

**ENOCH = Teaching** 

### מתוּשָׁלַח -METHUSELAH

Means "man of the dart", "sent and death, or "his death shall bring" in Hebrew. He lived to age 969, making him the longest-lived person in the Bible.

# METHUSELAH = His Death Shall Bring

למך -LAMECH

Means "to make low" or "the despairing" in Hebrew. Similar to English root for "lament". He lived 777 years.

# LAMECH = The Despairing

NOAH- מוֹח, בוֹח ווֹח

From the Hebrew name מַּחַ (Noach) meaning "rest, repose, or comfort", derived from the root חום (nuach). He lived 950 years.

NOAH = Comfort

ADAM = Man
SETH = Appointed
ENOSH = Mortal
KENAN = Sorrow
MAHALALEL = The Blessed God
JARED = Shall Come Down
ENOCH = Teaching
METHUSELAH = His Death Shall Bring
LAMECH = The Despairing
NOAH = Comfort

This is all informative, but what one can't see is that these names were pre-ordained by Yahovah.

### There are no coincidences in the Bible.

Yahovah had a specific reason for the interpretation and order of these names.

What happens if we list not the name, but the meanings of these names, in order.

Man **Appointed Mortal** Sorrow The Blessed God **Shall Come Down Teaching His Death Shall Bring** The Despairing **Comfort** 

### This almost sounds like a sentence.

It Is!

Man (is) appointed mortal sorrow, (but) the blessed God shall come down teaching (that), His death shall bring (the) despairing comfort.

Let's read that again.

Man (is) appointed mortal sorrow, (but) the blessed God shall come down teaching (that), His death shall bring (the) despairing comfort.

Here we have a summary of the Christian gospels hidden in the names of the genealogy of Adam through Noah.

Man (the writer of the scriptures) could not have done this, only Yahovah could have.

So here we have, hidden in the Torah, the basic foundational thought of the Gospels.

## Names have meaning in Hebrew.

Yahovah used those names to prove the divine nature of the Bible and foreshadows his son's (Yeshua's) purpose 3000-4000 years before his birth.
