- There are some things in the Bible that are for the nation of Israel and some for all the nations. Some things are for a community and some for the individual. Unfortunately through mistranslation, poor interpretation, tradition and doctrine certain concepts have been forgotten.
- We will look at just a few examples to demonstrate the importance of understanding which instructions are for whom.

Worship

"Stay here with the donkey," Abraham told his servants. "The boy and I will go over there to worship, and then we will return to you." Genesis 22:5

The next morning Elkanah and Hannah got up early to bow in worship before the LORD, and then returned home to Ramah. 1 Samuel 1:19

And Aaron relayed everything the LORD had said to Moses. And Moses performed the signs before the people, and they believed. And when they heard that the LORD had attended to the Israelites and had seen their affliction, they bowed down and worshiped Exodus 4:30—31

Who is (are) the son (s) of God?

Mark 15:39, When the centurion standing there in front of Jesus saw how He had breathed His last, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!"

Matthew 27:54, When the centurion and those with him who were guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified and said, "Truly this was the Son of God."

Matthew 16:16 Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Deuteronomy 32:6, Is this how you repay the LORD, O foolish and senseless people? Is He not your Father and Creator? Has He not made you and established you?

Isaiah 1:2, Hear, O heavens, and give ear, O earth: for the LORD hath spoken, I have nourished and brought up children, and they have rebelled against me.

Matthew 6:9 So then, this is how you should pray: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name.

Hebrews 2:11 For both the One who sanctifies and those who are sanctified are of the same family. So Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers.

Genesis 13:15 For all the land that you see, I will give to you and your offspring forever.

LEVITICUS 25:23—24 The land must not be sold permanently, because it is Mine, and you are but foreigners and residents with Me, for every piece of property you possess, you must provide for the redemption of the land.

Genesis 23:12—13 Again Abraham bowed down before the people of the land and said to Ephron in their presence, "If you will please listen to me, I will pay you the price of the field. Accept it from me, so that I may bury my dead there."

Numbers 36

Proverbs 31:16 She appraises a field and buys it; from her earnings she plants a vineyard.

Deuteronomy 5:30 You must walk in all the ways that the LORD your God has commanded you, so that you may live and prosper and prolong your days in the land that you will possess.

There are several examples of property being transferred

- Genesis 23, Abraham buys land to bury Sarah
- Ruth 4, Boaz buy land
- Jeremiah 32, Jeremiah buys land

Just a few examples that property was transferred

Other customs were

- Stake the land to show the boundaries
- Anoint the corners with oil to dedicate it to יהוה
- Anoint the doors and windows of any buildings
- Affix a Mezuzah to the doors
