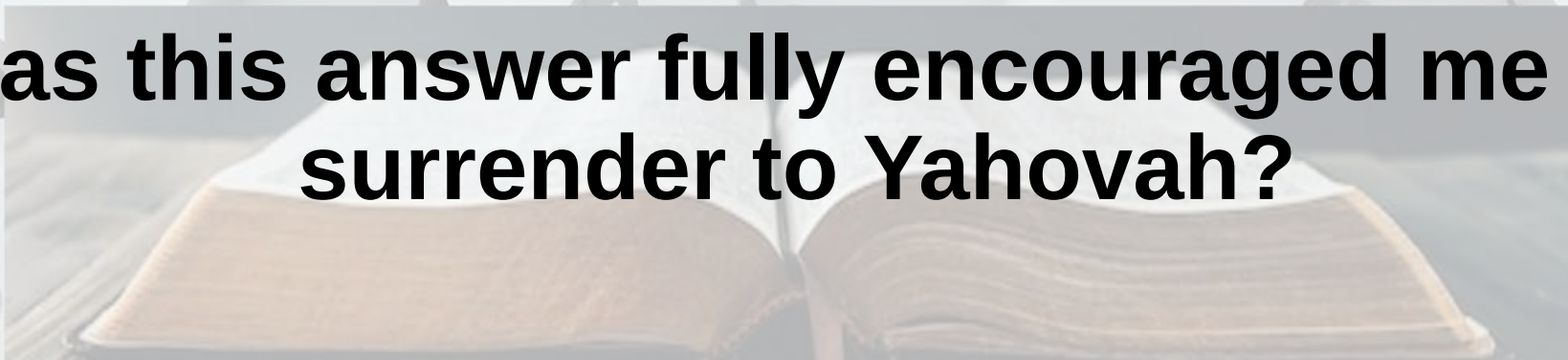
After answering these questions ask yourself:

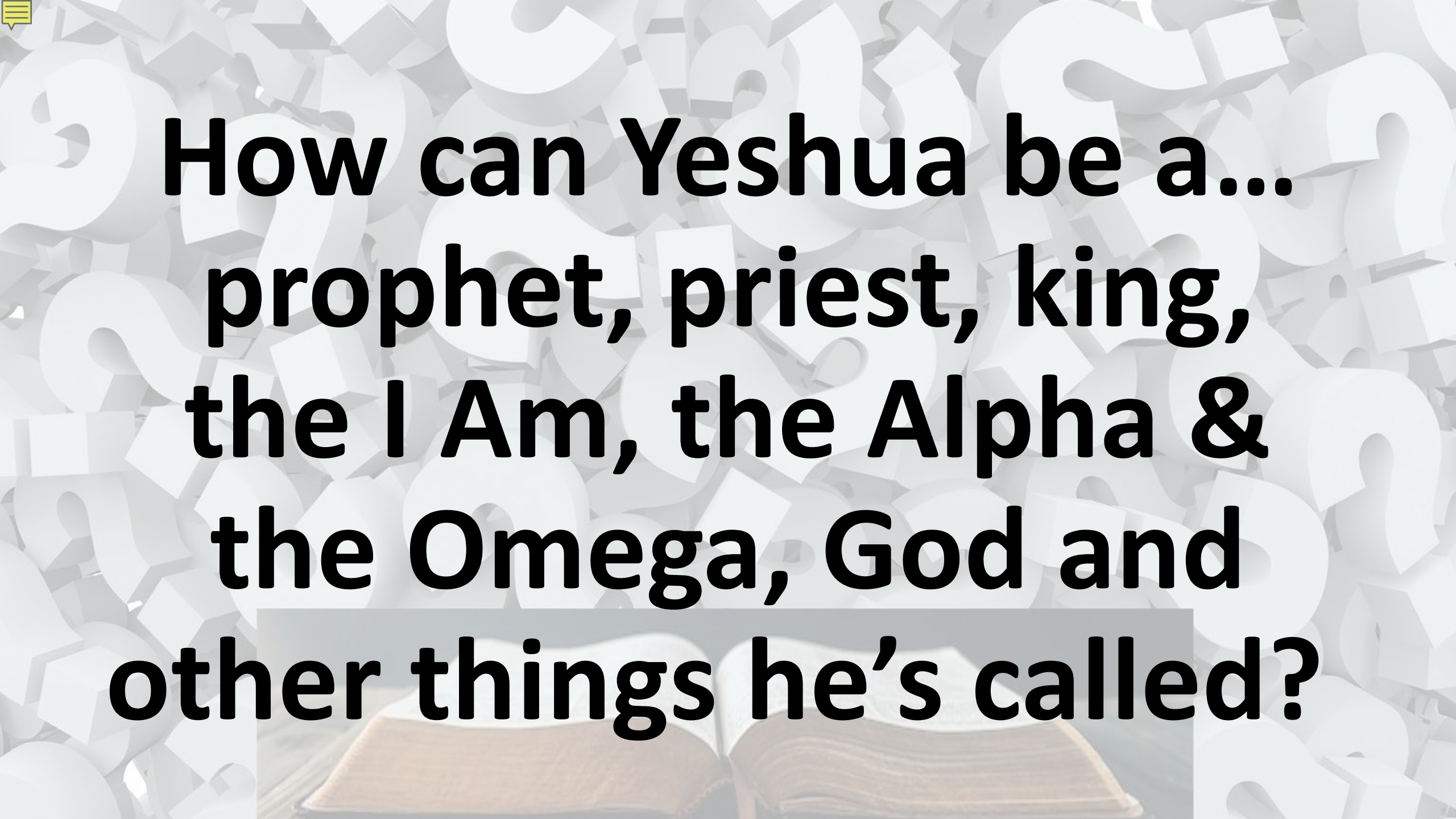
**How can Yeshua be a...

(Genesis 14:18-20)



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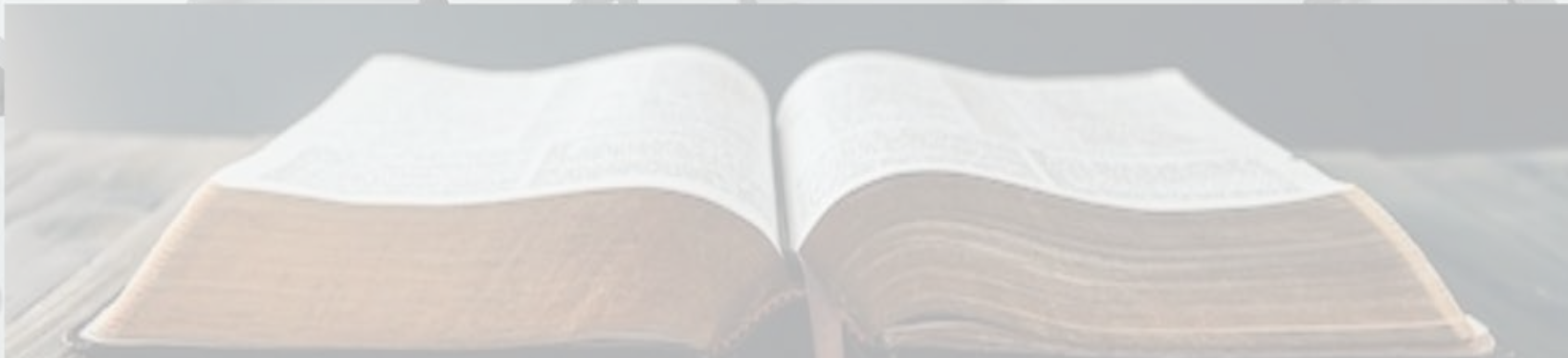
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Question 4

Someone who could interpret dreams was generally considered a prophet.

²⁵ Then Joseph said to Pharaoh, “The dreams of Pharaoh are one; God has revealed to Pharaoh what he is about to do. ²⁶ The seven good cows are seven years, and the seven good ears are seven years; the dreams are one. ²⁷ The seven lean and ugly cows that came up after them are seven years, and the seven empty ears blighted by the east wind are also seven years of famine. (Genesis 41:25-27)

Joseph & Yeshua Had Miraculous Births

**“Then God remembered Rachel; he listened to her and enabled her to conceive. She became pregnant and gave birth to a son and said, ‘God has taken away my disgrace.’ She named him Joseph.”
(Genesis 30:22–24)**

Joseph & Yeshua Were Shepherds

“Joseph, a young man of seventeen, was tending the flocks with his brothers.” (Genesis 37:2)
“I am the good shepherd. (John 10-11)



Joseph Is Loved By His Father & Then Stripped Of His Special Cloak

“When the soldiers crucified Jesus, they took his clothes, dividing them into four shares, one for each of them, with the undergarment remaining. (John 19:23)

Joseph And Yeshua Were Betrayed & Unjustly Condemned

Joseph’s brothers] said to each other. ‘Come now, let’s kill him and throw him into one of these cisterns and say that a ferocious animal devoured him. Then we’ll see what comes of his dreams.’” Genesis 37:19–20

“After this, Jesus went around in Galilee. He did not want to go about in Judea because the Jewish leaders there were looking for a way to kill him (John 7:1)



Joseph & Yeshua Are “Resurrected” To Save The World That Betrayed Them

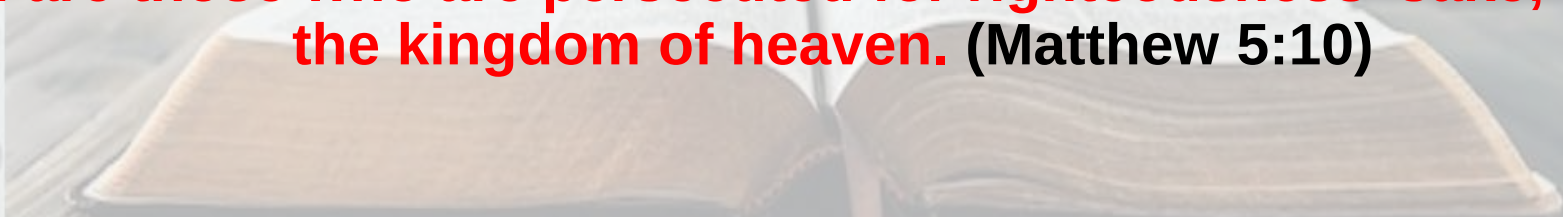
“When the famine had spread over the whole country, Joseph opened all the storehouses and sold grain to the Egyptians, for the famine was severe throughout Egypt. And all the world came to Egypt to buy grain from Joseph, because the famine was severe everywhere.” (Genesis 41:56–57)

Joseph Leads His Brothers To Repentance Through Hardship

“Your servant guaranteed the boy’s safety to my father. I said, ‘If I do not bring him back to you, I will bear the blame before you, my father, all my life!’ Now then, please let your servant remain here as my lord’s slave in place of the boy, and let the boy return with his brothers.” (Genesis 44:32–33)

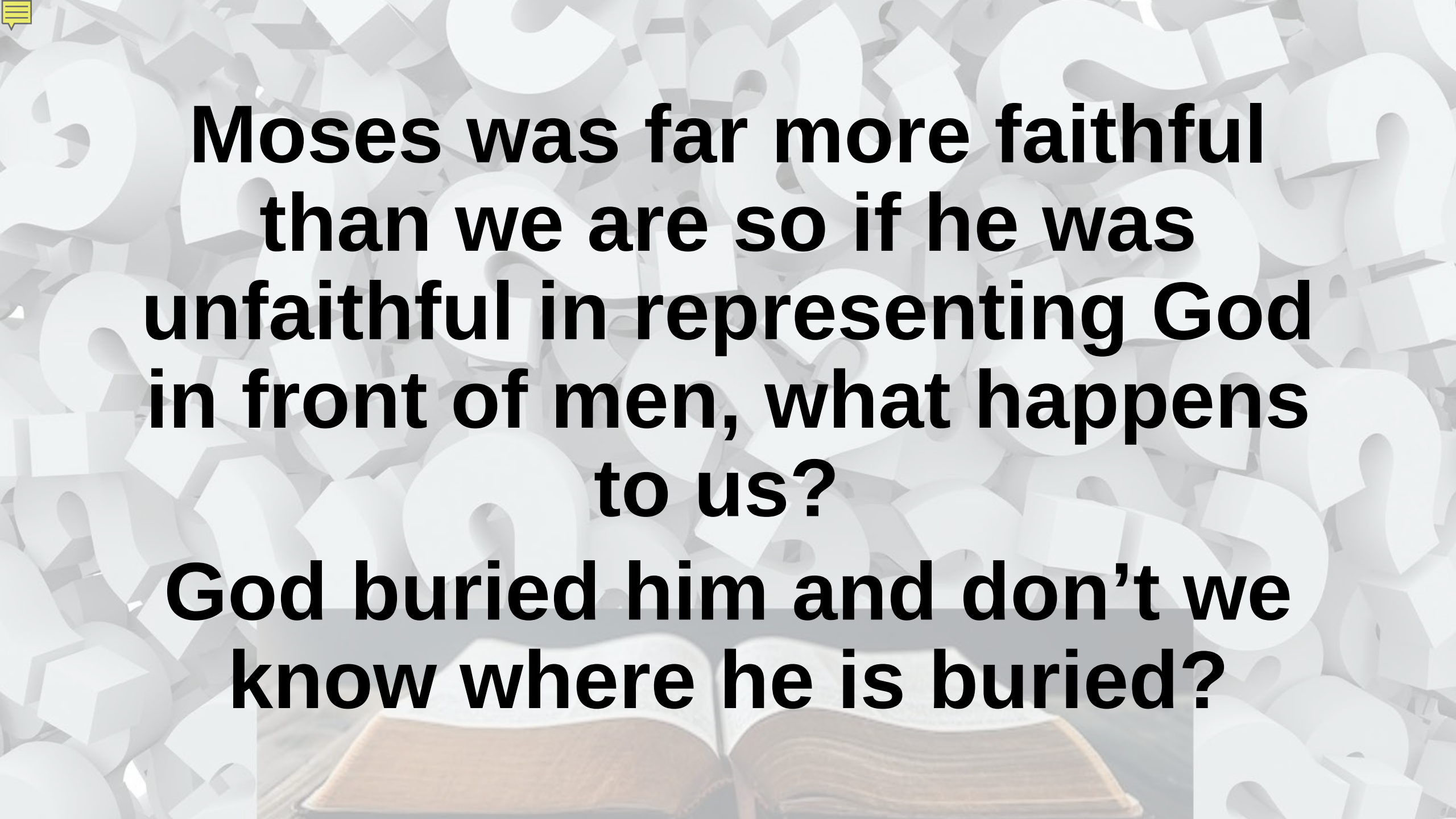
(Hebrews 3:1-3)

But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart” (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.
