





Unlike previous teachings, led by one person, this teaching is based on the input of all the Fellowship attendees.


Using one Biblical chapter, the Fellowship will dissect and analyze the chapter, hopefully providing new insights to all that are present.

Isaiah contains the prophecies attributed to the prophet Isaiah and is one of the Nevi'im. Chapters 40 to 55 are known as "Deutero-Isaiah" and date from the time of the Israelites' exile in Babylon.



Isaiah 52:13–53:12 makes up the fourth of the "Servant Songs" of the Book of Isaiah, describing a "servant" of God who is abused but eventually vindicated.






**⁷ He was oppressed, and he was afflicted,

**⁷ He was maltreated, yet he was
submissive, He did not open his mouth;
Like a sheep being led to slaughter, Like a
ewe, dumb before those who shear her, He
did not open his mouth. (JSB)**




⁸ He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. (KJV)

⁸ By oppressive judgment he was taken away, Who could describe his abode? For he was cut off from the land of the living Through the sin of my people, who deserved the punishment. (JSB)




9 And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth. (KJV)

9 And his grave was set among the wicked, And with the rich, in his death - Though he had done no injustice and had spoken no falsehood. (JSB)






**11 He shall see of the travail of his soul,
