

#### Our Thoughts Psalm 139 Part 2

Unlike previous teachings, led by one person, this teaching is based on the input of all the Fellowship attendees.

Using one Biblical chapter, the Fellowship will dissect and analyze the chapter, hopefully providing new insights to all that are present.

Each verse will be analyzed while being displayed in both the King James Version (KJV) and the Jewish Study Bible Version (JSB).

#### However, each Fellowship member is free to use their own version of the Bible in making their analysis.

# Psalm 139 Part 2

Psalm 139 is part of the Ketuvim (בְתוּבִים) - the third and final section of the Hebrew Bible. This section of the Old Testament is usually titled "Writings" or "Hagiographa". It follows after the Torah ("Instructions") and the Nevi'im ("Prophets").

### There are 24 verses in Chapter 139.

13 For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. (KJV)

<sup>13</sup> It was You who created my conscience. You fashioned me in my mother's womb. (JSB) 14 I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well. (KJV)

<sup>14</sup> I praise You, for I am awesomely, wondrously made; Your work is wonderful; I know it very well. (JSB) <sup>15</sup> My substance was not hid from thee, when I was made in secret, and curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth. (KJV)

15 My frame was not concealed from You when I was shaped in a hidden place, knit together in the recesses of the earth. (JSB)

Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being unperfect; and in thy book all my members were written, which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there was none of them. (KJV)

16 Your eyes saw my unformed limbs; they were all recorded in Your book; in due time they were formed, to the very last one of them. (JSB)

17 How precious also are thy thoughts unto me, O Yahovah! how great is the sum of them! (KJV)

17 How weighty Your thoughts seem to me, 0 Yahovah, how great their number! (JSB)

## 18 If I should count them, they are more in number than the sand: when I awake, I am still with thee. (KJV)

<sup>18</sup> I count them-they exceed the grains of sand; I end-but am still with You. (JSB)

19 Surely thou wilt slay the wicked, O Yahovah: depart from me therefore, ye bloody men. (KJV)

<sup>19</sup> 0 Yahovah, if You would only slay the wicked you murderers, away from me! - (JSB)

<sup>20</sup> For they speak against thee wickedly, and thine enemies take thy name in vain. (KJV) <sup>20</sup> who invoke You for intrigue, Your enemies who swear by You falsely. (JSB)

Hopefully analyzing Psalm 139 in this way has increased your understanding and appreciation of this chapter in the Bible.
