The Feast of Unleavened Bread

Highlights of Saudi Arabia

Exodus 23:15 Thou shalt keep the feast of unleavened bread: (thou shalt eat unleavened bread seven days, as I commanded thee, in the time appointed out from Egypt, and non shall appear before me empty.

What is the purpose of eating unleavened bread for 7 days?

Exodus 12:14

- 14) And this day shall be unto you for a memorial, and ye shall keep it a feast to YHWH throughout your generations, ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance forever.
- 15) Seven days shall ye eat unleavened bread, even the first day ye shall put away leaven out of your houses for whosoever eateth leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day, that soul shall be cut off from Israel.
- 16) And in the first day there shall be a holy convocation, and in the seventh day shall be an holy convocation to you, no manner of work shall be done in them save that which every man must eat, that only may be done of you.

- 17) And ye shall observe the feast of unleavened bread, for in this selfsame day have I brought your armies out of the land of Egypt, therefore shall ye observe this day in your generations by an ordinance forever.
- 18) In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at even, ye shall eat unleavened bread, until the one and twentieth day of the month at even.
- 19) Seven days shall there be no leaven found in your houses, for whosoever eateth that which is leavened, even that soul shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he be a stranger or born in the land

20) Ye shall eat nothing leavened, in all your habitations shall ye eat unleavened bread.

So why 7 days of unleavened bread?







Could the feast of Unleavened Bread be to remember the first 7 days of leaving Egypt and leaving sin behind?

Could the Feast of Unleavened Bread represent the 7000 years of man's journey and then the redemption at the narrow gate?

Or could it be both?
